Professional Sports Competitions Guidelines



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During the COVID-19 public health emergency, owners/management of professional sports teams and professional sporting venues should stay up to date with any changes to state and federal requirements related professional sports and incorporate those changes into their operations. This guidance is not intended to replace any existing applicable local, state, and federal laws, regulations, and standards.

This document is predicated on the tenet that no live audience, fans, or spectators will be authorized to

Ensure that only team athletes and essential staff are allowed in designated team areas (e.g. locker rooms, athlete lounges, training areas, athlete medical areas) Ensure that media interactions, including post-game interviews, always follow appropriate social distancin Limit in-person gatherings (e.g. team meetings, coaching briefings) as much as possible. Establish designated areas for pick-ups and deliveries limiting contact to the extent possible. Develop a plan for people to maintain six feet of socia distance while queuing inside or outside of the buildin for screening, as applicable. If non essential amenities and communal are open, make hand sanitizer or disinfecting wipes available ne to equipment near such amenities (e.g. vending machines, communal coffee stations, club houses). 	more than one individual at a time, unless all individuals are wearing face coverings. Post social distancing markers using tape or signs that denote 6 ft. of spacing in commonly used and other applicable areas (e.g. elevator entrances, escalators, lobbies, health screening stations, etc.). Encourage social distancing by limiting occupancy or closing non-essential amenities/communal areas that don't allow for social distancing protocols.	
Workplace Activity	Follow all applicable DOH guidance, such as: Interim COVID-19 Guidance for Offices for any activities taking place in offices. Interim COVID-19 Guidance for Professional Sports Training Facilities for any activities taking place in venue training facilities. Interim COVID-19 Guidance for Personal Care for any activities related to massage therapy of spas, or makeup, as applicable. Interim COVID-19 Guidance for Food Services for any activities related to food/beverage. Finsure that all team staff, athletes, and venue personnel receive training on COVID-19 safety, prope hand hygiene, and cleaning and disinfection protocols.	of providing food/beverages to essential personnel. Keep maintenance of facilities to the minimum standard required to execute competitions (i.e. only allowing personnel to return who are essential to preparation of the field of play or facilities).	



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Recommended Best Practices Mandatory Ensure that all individuals wear appropriate face Encourage use of gloves and eye protection for support **Protective** coverings when in the venue at all times, except for staff that regularly interact with athletes in close contact Equipment athletes when engaged in training, warming up, or (e.g. trainers, physicians, conditioning coaches, ball competition and broadcast media personnel when it handlers, attendants, trainers, medical staff). interferes with the core activity. Athletes must don face coverings after completion of any of the above activities, or before active competition such as when standing/sitting on the sidelines. If gloves are not worn, staff must perform hand hygiene before and after close contact with athletes. Provide employees, players, and team staff within the venue with an acceptable face covering at no-cost to the employee, player, or team staff. Allow team staff, athletes, and venue personnel to use their own acceptable face coverings or additional personal protective equipment. Acceptable face coverings include but are not limited to cloth (e.g. homemade sewn, quick cut, bandana) and surgical masks, unless the nature of the work requires stricter PPE (e.g. N95 respirator, face shield). Face coverings must be cleaned or replaced after use and may not be shared. Consult CDC guidance. Implement measures to limit the sharing of objects, such as equipment, materials, and vehicles, as well as the touching of shared surfaces; or, require employees, athletes, and team staff to wear gloves (tradeappropriate or medical) when in contact with shared objects/frequently touched surfaces, if practicable; or require employees, athletes, and team staff to perform hand hygiene before and after contact. Train employees on how to adequately put on, take off, clean (as applicable), and discard PPE.

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Mandatory Recommended Best Practices Adhere to hygiene, cleaning, and disinfection Place signage near hand sanitizer stations indicating that Hygiene, Cleaning, requirements from the Centers for Disease Control and visibly soiled hands should be washed with soap and and Disinfection Prevention (CDC) and Department of Health (DOH) and maintain logs that document date, time, and scope of cleaning and disinfection. Place receptacles around the venue for disposal of soiled items, including PPE. Provide and maintain hand hygiene stations, including handwashing with soap, running warm water, and Collect and launder linens (towels, uniforms, clothing) on paper towels, as well as an alcohol-based hand sanitizer site if possible, and encourage athletes to deposit used containing 60% or more alcohol for areas where linens in designated bins without handling by other handwashing is not feasible. individuals such as equipment managers or attendants. Ensure that athletes perform hand hygiene before and Assign cleaning staff to certain areas of the venue (e.g. after inserting or removing mouthguards. locker rooms) in order to limit cross contamination throughout the facility. Conduct regular cleaning and disinfection of the venue Prohibit any spitting within the venue at any time and any and more frequent cleaning and disinfection of high risk products that require spitting (e.g. smokeless tobacco, areas used by many individuals and for frequently sunflower seeds). touched surfaces. Clean and disinfect any medical areas including tables and surfaces between each use or exam. Ensure regular cleaning and disinfection of restrooms. Ensure that all athlete areas are appropriately and effectively cleaned and disinfected after the end of each practice and competition.

Hygiene, Cleaning, and Disinfection (cont'd)	Prohibit shared food and beverages (e.g. self-serve meals and beverages) and reserve adequate space for team and venue personnel to observe social distancing while eating meals. Ensure that all saunas, hot tubs, cryotherapy chambers, or similar enclosed spaces remain closed. Prohibit sharing of any personal items (e.g. water bottles, equipment, towels, toiletries, clothing, supplements) among team staff and athletes.	ended Best Practices

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Recommended Best Practices Mandatory Implement diagnostic testing for COVID-19 for all Perform screening remotely (e.g. by telephone or Screening athletes and essential team staff with regular player electronic survey), before people arrive, to the extent access 48 hours before a competition, where feasible, possible. given lab operating hours and turnaround time, regardless of antibody test results or history of Coordinate screening to prevent individuals from infection. intermingling in close or proximate contact with each other. Implement mandatory daily health screenings for team staff, athletes, and venue personnel prior to any Implement pre-travel screening for any teams travelling engagement in professional sports activities, as well as domestically or internationally. Designate a central point of contact, which may vary by activity, location, shift or day, responsible for receiving and attesting to having reviewed all team staff, athlete, and venue personnel questionnaires, with such contact also identified as the party for team staff, athletes, or venue personnel to inform if they later are experiencing COVID-19-related symptoms, as noted on the questionnaire. Require any team staff, athlete, and/or venue personnel to immediately disclose if and when any responses to screening questions change, such as if they begin to experience symptoms.

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
